PRESIDENT'S REPORT

1979 - 80

Our third Season in the Municipal and Shire Competition has ended with some praise and some misgivings.

The B-Team performed remarkably well and only have themselves to blame for those few points needed which would have put them into the semi-finals with the great chance of winning the competition such was their improved performance in the second half of the draw. Congratulations to the Captain, Henry Bouveng, for his leadership.

Initially the A-Team looked like a formidable combination, but for the loss of three key players due to an overseas trip, moving away from the district and then a late change of Captaincy, there was little hope to be amongst the top teams.

Our Club needs more teams to give it depth to overcome these contingencies so that the A and B teams can be always made up with the best players.

The acquisition of a synthetic turf practice wicket purchased and fixed by Club members beside the Weldon Oval, the sending of four members to Barry Knight's Coaching School at Club expense and the purchase of materials with labour from the members to build sight screens for Weldon Oval shows the Club to be outgoing and progressive.

Much credit for the progress is owed to our Secretary, Frank Gray, who never ceases to work for the good of cricket in the Manly-Warringah area. His efforts certainly do not go unnoticed. Ray Pitt and Mike Syme are always on hand to help out, so too are our ladies for their wonderful support at the social functions and for the afternoon teas each Saturday.

Further thanks are extended to the Staff of Warringah-Shire Council for the extra wire netting to the practice wicket, and for the continued maintenance and upkeep of the cricket facilities at Weldon Oval. The co-operation received is most appreciated and in particular special thanks to the groundsman, Jim Scott, who goes out of his way to assist the Club.

It is hoped, after an early set back that the Council can see its way clear to provide the second turf wicket beside Weldon Oval so necessary to accommodate extra teams to join the Municipal & Shire Competition to give young players valuable turf experience before trying out for grade with the District Club. In a limited way, already players from our Club are now performing admirably in the District Club.

Our continued progress is assured after we set-up extra teams in the coming Season. This will enable our Club to come on in strength to allow us to even get closer in co-operation with the Manly District Cricket Club and the Manly-Warringah Cricket Association all to the benefit of cricket in our area.

For it was this - lack of application that cost us many matches.

I would like to on behalf of the "A" Grade side congratulate the Epping District Cricket Club in winning the "A" Grade premiership in particular, along with the other three grade premierships and Club Championship. A fine effort, one which we will try to emulate next season.

To President Bruce Loudon and Secretary Frank Gray, on behalf of the team I would like to offer you our appreciation and thanks for the untiring efforts you both contributed to the 1979-80 season.

I think for me, the greatest achievement of the season was to see the tremendous performances put up by our "B" grade players, when several of them were elevated to "A" grade. These young men showed the dedication, determination and self-discipline, qualities which are the hallmark of success, not only of top higher grade cricketers but also of good citizenship and teammanship. In the season coming many of these young men must be considered as regular "A" graders and reap the rewards of playing a couple of seasons in "B" grade.

I took over the captaincy from John Briscoe after the eighth round and I would personally like to thank all the players who played with us during the season for the support and co-operation which they afforded me.

Individual performances are next on the agenda and I will start off by discussing the performance of that "big fella" who constantly may be heard addressing me as "Lick-Lick". Of course I'm talking about one of the new recruits of the 1979-80 season... Mark Isaacs - whom I think we should call "Lazarus" next season.

Mark arrived at practice last Spring fresh from New Guinea where he had spent the previous season a...counting coconuts and bowling maidens over ... or so he told us. We threw him the ball and observed he was a fast bowler, just what we were looking for. A few Saturdays later he had lost a stone or so and by the end of the season, there he was winner of the "A" grade Bowling Average and "Clubman of the Year" award. Thanks for the great effort Mark.

Our second new recruit was "Mittens" Winter - Bob Winter, charged with wicket-keeping duties. Bob made his mark early in the season. He took two fine catches in the first match of the season after about only twenty minutes of play.

"Mittens" then made like a swallow to attempt a tremendous leg side catch, (which was denied by the umpire) however we didn't hear the customary "How's Zatt!!", instead we heard a horrible tearing sound as "Mittens" slipped a disc.

Consequently "Mittens" spent the early part of the season 3 matches as chief scorer and fan. "Mittens" showed some great talent with the bat, on several occasions with good scores at No.8 thus allowing the side to accrue a more respectable total. Don's absence from the team certainly affected our batting strength. Don left to undertake a Wine Marketing Course in South Australia and I sincerely hope he returns to the side. Apart from his cricketing prowess Don was also a great club man.

Tony Underwood had an indifferent season with the bat. At one stage Tony could not find any form and then "out of the blue" against Pennant Hills he put together a fine 104 not-out as fine an innings as I've ever seen scored in the "A" grade competition. Unfortunately this form left him shortly and he did not recapture it.

John Briscoe had a terrible start to the season. It seemed the harder John tried the worst would happen with the bat. He devised more ways of "getting out" at one stage than Houdini himself. However immediately John resigned the captaincy he produced the form we all know he is capable of. In the last four or five games he compiled over 250 runs, and we wish him good fortune with the bat in the new season.

Terry Seacy, unfortunately was only available for a few games. "The Pom" of course did his "stuff" as usual against Roseville with a seven wicket bag in one innings. We all know what a great bowler Terry is, and his loss was certainly felt.

Peter "Dadda" Massey had a great season and produced a fine daughter - Anne Elizabeth. Congratulations to Peter and Carol from all of us. Peter bowled very well, but lacked the penetration he found in other seasons - probably because of the "dropped catches syndrome" which plagued all bowlers this season. However I'm sure Peter will be hard to "toss" for the bowling honours in the new season.

Peter was also a great clubman during the season and I must personally thank him for the support he gave me this season.

David Mostyn although not available in the early matches produced the potential we all knew he had, by winning the "A" grade batting trophy. David has and always will be a valuable member of the team. He has that rare ability to tear any attack to shreds. However David must develop the ability to "go on with it" and take his scores of fifty to a hundred. He is a great fieldsman and bowled very well on the limited opportunities he got.

Another new member to the club this year was Paul Curtis. Paul bowled very well and was very unlucky not to finish with more wickets. I feel that his back injury prevented him from producing his "best" which I know he is capable of.

The Father and Son combination of Bruce and Ross Louden proved to be a formidable combination to the opposition. Bruce although he did not play all season "felled" by a "bouncer" earlier in the season came back to show us all how to bat - especially against the spinners. We can all learn a lot from Bruce and I understand that he will not be available to play next season, however I will always welcome his constructive comments on players techniques and match tactics. He is a thorough gentleman and a great inspiration to all of us.

"Rosco" Louden promoted to the "opening bat" position later in the season, played his heart out and batted very well. He played some glorious cover drives and I feel that if Ross seeks some advice from his Dad and someone such as Barry Knight, he will develop into a great batsman. "Get on the front foot Ross" and the runs will come. It was great to have you in the side Ross.

John "Lover Boy" Symes bowled extremely well in the "A" grade games he played. He has plenty of pace good length and a big heart - (both for cricket and my wife). I feel if John works at acquiring the accuracy of line bowling and does some physical body building he will be a great fast bowler. It was a pleasure to have you in the side John:

Tony "Artie" Austin also performed creditably in his games with us. He has a great all rounder ability and should develop into a fine cricketer. Thanks for the help "Artie".

Michael Lennon only played a few games this season with us, however he batted very well indeed. If Mike works on the short-ball on leg stump I'm sure he will accumulate many runs.

Well, by the time this report hits the press, most of us of course will be getting fit for the new season. With our new practice wicket and sight screens, we can look forward to more beneficial practice sessions before the new season.

I think that if each of us works on the weaknesses that we know we have, - it might be not keeping a straight bat to dropping catches. Then we will have made a personal commitment to the club to lift our effort.

I am happy to say that sportsmanship always prevailed in our matches during the past season and I'm looking forward to the new season. Warringah to Win!!!

"B" GRADE CAPTAINS REPORT

1979-80 has been a most pleasing season in all facets of the game. The team overall ran 6th in the competition narrowly missing a spot in the semi-finals. Throughout the season there was a most evident team spirit, which in turn made my job as Captain a real pleasure. Everyone pulled their weight, and excepting for the odd (repeat odd) dropped catch the overall team fielding was of the highest order, with some great catches being taken.

There was a good sprinkling of fine individual performances during the year with the trophy winners Steve Hutchison and Tony Austin being outstanding - Stuart Jansson had a fine year as Vice-Captain with the added responsibility certainly giving his game a new image. A pen portrait of players follows:-

HENRY BOUVENG - Leave to the Editor.

STUART JANSSON - Stuart had a much improved season behind the stumps taking a total of 24 catches. He cracked the 200 barrier, with perhaps his best innings a fine 34 against Bexley where he and Tony Austin put on a 107 run partnership.

MICK LAY - "Bones" had a poor start to the year, but really started to put his act together after Xmas. Is a fine driver of the ball - and a lot more runs should come from bat next season. A fine ground fielder with a strong arm.

ALAN HICKS - For a "60 year old" Alan had a good season - propping up our middle order on numerous occasions. His innings of 61 against Lindfield was a top effort, keeping his more flamboyant partner in check as they raced to a record partnership of 151.

MARK NORMAN - had a year he probably would like to forget. He really never got going with the bat all year, except for a well put together 41 against Auburn. Proved to be a good team man all year, and a lot more runs should be in store next year.

JOHN SYME - shows a lot of ability as an all rounder - which is evidenced by his averages in both areas. Batted well with perhaps his two best efforts a 36 against Roseville and 26 against Burwood. Was unlucky not to take more wickets as he beat the bat on numerous occasions.

STEVE HUTCHISON - "Hutch" had his finest year ever - culminating with his 122 against Lindfield. His century was bought up with a towelling 6. Played a number of other fine innings, with in my opinion his 54 against Burwood being his best knock of the year. Bowled his offies well when called upon - and put a lot of effort into his fielding.

TONY AUSTIN - Tony had an outstanding season - considering it was his first full year on turf. His figures speak for themselves - 286 runs at 35.8 and 41 wickets at 14.3. His 73 against Bexley was incredible, going to the crease with the score at 6-72 he took to the bowling hitting 7 x 6's and 5 x 4's. His 6-12 against Roseville off 18 overs was a top effort including 13 maidens. Even when not taking wickets Tony bowled his hear out, and was an inspiration to the rest of the team with the effort he put into everything he did.

MIKE MCKEAND - was the youngest member of the team and his inexperience let him down on a number of occasions. At times he bowled really well with 3-13 against Burwood being his best figures. Mike learnt a lot during the year, and with his keenness in the field and general attitude to his cricket he should have a real big year in 80-81.

GARY PITT - Up until Xmas Gary had taken only 2 wickets - for 151 and was naturally down in the dumps. Gary and the team were naturally a lot happier for the 2nd part of the season where his figures were 16 - 174, with the highlight being a superb 7-23 against Roseville. Didn't have all that many opportunities with the bat this year - Gary took a number of good catches including a top caught and bowled against Pennant Hills.

DAVID SYME - David had quite a remarkable season - scoring 270 runs at 30.0, 15 wicket at 19.1 and took 13 catches - some of which can not adequately be described in writing. David proved to be the ideal team man, rarely letting the team down in any facet of the game. The highlights of his season were undoubtedly a 79 N.O. against Roseville and 4-22 off 12 overs against Macquarie. Special note should be made of the 7 catches taken off his Captains bowling - Thanks David!

ROSS LOUDON - Ross only played the 1st half of the season with the "B" Prior to going up to "A" Grade. On a number of times Ross batted really well, with his 33 N.O. against Bexley being a fine effort. With the experience gained this season Ross should score a lot more runs next season.

HENRY BOUVENG - Henry is too modest to tell of his undoubted ability. Space does not permit to list all of his qualities. Suffice to say the team spirit he mentioned is due primarily to Henry's leadership.
