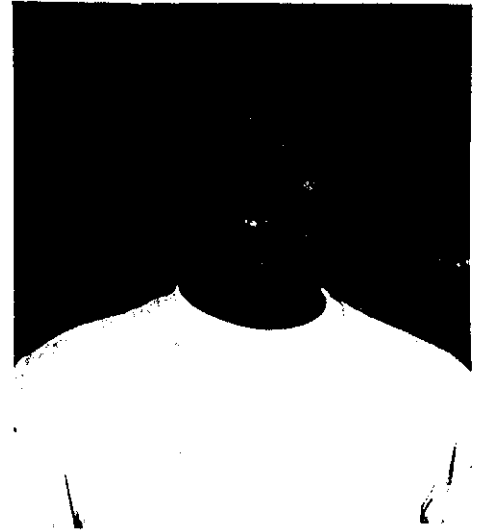
I wish the D2s the best of luck for the remainder of the season - and after we beat Epping 1 we look forward to a return bout in the finals.

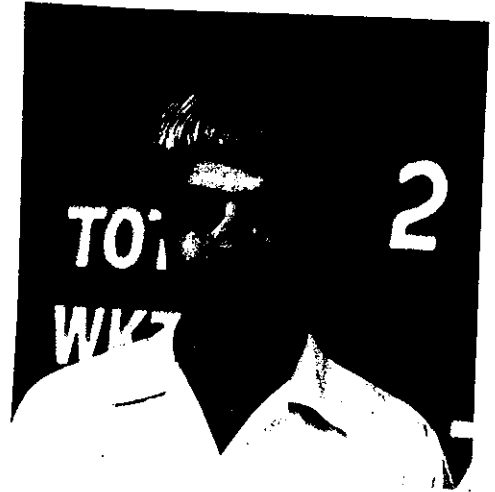
