GENERAL RULES - SEASON 1989/90

DRESS:

The Club will not tolerate poor dress on the field and players must be dressed as follows:-

Trousers -	Long white or cream
Shirt -	White or cream with collar, long or short sleeves
Boots -	White
Socks -	White or cream
Pullovers -	White or cream
Caps -	Club Cap
Hair -	Must be tidy

PUNCTUATLITY:

All players must be dressed and ready to play 15 minutes before commencement of play.

TEAM SELECTIONS:

Apart from cricketing ability, selectors will consider a players adherence to the club's rules and attendance at practices. Selections will be made and players notified a few days before the start of each match.

CAPTAINS:

Captains will lead teams on to the field at all times.

VICE CAPTAINS:

Vice captains are to organise:-

- (a) umpires
- (b) afternoon tea when playing at home

GEAR STEWARDS:

Gear stewards are to organise for pads, stumps and bails for use by both teams at home games.

UMPIRES:

Players must be willing to assist with umpiring duties. Blue coats must be worn at all times.

END OF DAYS PLAY:

All players are asked to socialise with the other team members, particularly at home games.

MATCH RESULTS:

The captain must forward completed match results sheets to the appropriate body to arrive by the following Thursday.

PUBLICITY:

The publicity officer must phone scores after each Saturday's play to the appropriate body.

INSURANCE:

All players are covered under the N.S.W. Sporting Injuries Workers Compensation Act.

HOURS OF PLAY:

Before daylight saving - 12.30 p.m. to 5.30 p.m.  
After daylight saving - 1.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m.
